Thesis Semantic and Phonological Activation Among Hong Kong Deaf Readers

Benefit to Thesis

During this trip, I received training in eye-tracking using an SMI eye-tracker and also introductory training in EEG experimentation and analysis using the EGI system.

After completing this training, I was able to conduct a pilot eye-tracking study at the University of Melbourne. The results from this study are being written into a paper called "The effect of word predictability on phonological activation in reading Chinese: A study of eye-fixations and pupillary response"

Receiving this training and gaining experience through the pilot study gave me the strong background I needed to collect my data in Hong Kong during my field research trip. I have successfully completed all data collection needed to complete my dissertation.

Benefit to CoEDL

My study is looking at the acquisition of literacy among signing deaf readers, a topic which is still not fully understood and receives limited attention in the literature. So far, one paper has been produced which involved a collaboration between researchers at Melbourne University and University of Queensland. The remaining EEG and eye-tracking studies that are currently undergoing analysis will contribute further to our understanding of literacy acquisition among users of sign languages.
